Research Policy



The Karve Institute of Social Service emphasizes the importance of research and related activities. The research policy provides guidelines for the conduct and dissemination of high-quality research across the institute.

1. The research policy adheres to the ethics of research, including the academic integrity outlined by the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the affiliating university.
2. A Research Committee consisting of Director and co-ordinator will be established to promote and sustain the research culture within the college. The committee, headed by the Academic and Research Coordinator (ARC), will make decisions on research matters critical to the institution.
3. Conducting research-related programs such as seminars, conferences, symposia, and workshops is highly encouraged.
4. Faculty members interested in attending research events outside the college, either in the same city or at other locations in India, will be reimbursed for registration fees, transportation allowance (T.A.), and dearness allowance (D.A.), where applicable.
5. Research conducted at the college will be defined, prioritized, and focused on contemporary, relevant topics.
6. The college acknowledges and appreciates the research achievements of its faculty across different disciplines.
7. Essential infrastructure for research will be provided by the college, and research facilities will be augmented in departments as necessary.
8. Financial and other support for research will be allocated based on a transparent, merit-based decision-making process.
9. Faculty research outcomes will be incorporated into the teaching process to benefit student learning and outcomes.



10. Faculty members will be encouraged to engage in quality research, publish their findings in reputed journals, and file patents wherever possible.
11. The college encourages faculty members to undertake research projects by providing all possible support.
12. The college promotes outreach programs and non-financial consultancy services for industry, government, and NGOs, benefiting society from the expertise available in the institution.
13. Research collaborations and linkages with foreign universities will be established and highly encouraged.
14. Faculty and student exchanges between institutions for research purposes, both national and international, will be supported for enhanced learning and exposure.
15. Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with reputed institutions, industries, and organizations will be established to facilitate research projects and internships.
