

"Is Indian Economy in a Situation of Stagflation?"

Abstract:

The rise in retail price inflation to six years high of 7.35% in December 2019, the rise in the rate of unemployment to three years high of 8.5% and fall in the GDP growth rate to 4.8% in the first quarter of 2020 (IMF) the lowest over six years, has led to a fear of stagflation.

The Indian economy has faced continuous slow growth since 2018. Economic growth for the current year was expected to be 5%. According to some economists, this slowdown is due to lack of sufficient demand for goods and services. Therefore, the government and many others suggested that, the RBI should cut interest rates in order to boost demand. But in spite of continuous reductions in repo rate the prices of goods began to rise at a faster rate. This situation has led Indian economy to slide towards stagflation.

On this background, an attempt is made in this paper to examine whether the Indian economy is really in a situation of stagflation or not.
