Introduction:

The "Fire and Safety" workshop was organized on January 19, 2019, at Patel Hall by Karve Institute of Social Service, Pune. 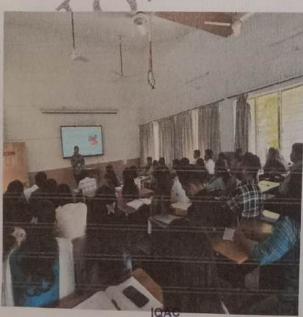
Learning:

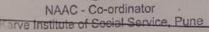
Key learnings from the workshop included:

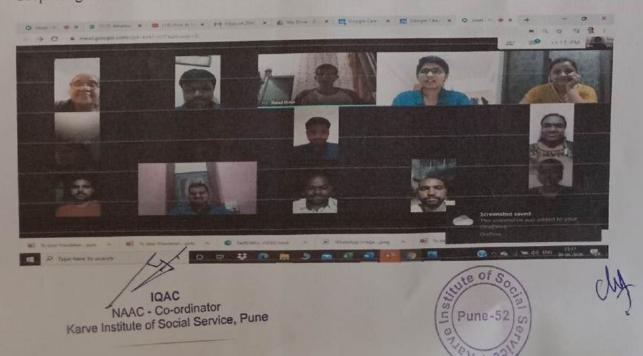

Report on Online Training Program on 'Basics of Excel

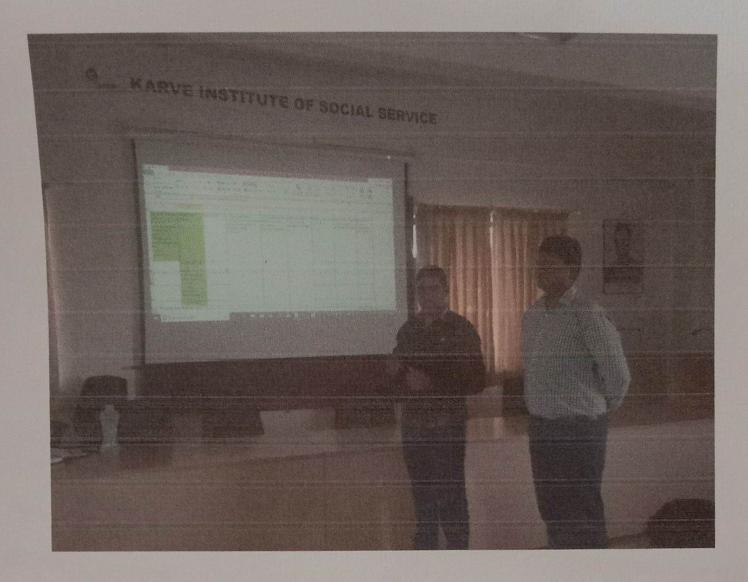

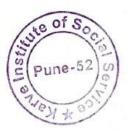

The workshop had a significant impact on the participants:

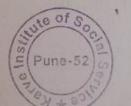
- Increased Self-Awareness: Participants gained a deeper understanding of their own strengths and weaknesses, which is essential for personal development.

INTRODUCTION:

The COVID-19 pandemic and the ensuing lockdown presented unprecedented challenges to counseling practices. This online session was organized for first- and second-year Master of Social Work (MSW) students to explore how the lockdown affected counseling services, especially in terms of accessibility, mental health demands, and adapting to digital platforms. The session was led by experienced professionals in the field of mental health and social work, aiming to provide insights into the challenges faced by counsellors during the lockdown and how they overcame these barriers.

OBJECTIVES:

- To discuss the impact of the COVID-19 lockdown on mental health counseling practices.
- 2. To identify the primary challenges faced by counselors in delivering services during the pandemic.
- To explore adaptive strategies and innovative solutions implemented by counselors during the lockdown.
- To provide MSW students with a broader understanding of the professional realities of counseling during crisis situations.

PARTICIPATION:

The session was attended by approximately 100 MSW students from both first and second years. Participants had diverse backgrounds in social work, ranging from community-based services to clinical social work settings. The session was conducted via a virtual platform, and students engaged actively in discussions through Q&A sessions, polls, and group discussions in virtual breakout rooms.





IMPACT:

The session had a significant impact on participants:

- Understanding Real-World Challenges: Students gained valuable insights into the
 practical difficulties faced by counselors during the pandemic, such as the abrupt shift
 to tele-counseling, the lack of face-to-face interactions, and managing client anxieties
 remotely.
- Increased Awareness of Mental Health: Participants were made aware of the heightened mental health issues that arose due to isolation, economic instability, and health concerns during the lockdown.
- Adaptive Counseling Techniques: The session highlighted various techniques and platforms that counselors adopted, including digital counseling methods, telephonic therapy, and using online tools for assessments and follow-ups.
- 4. Ethical and Privacy Concerns: Participants learned about the ethical dilemmas related to online counseling, such as maintaining confidentiality, ensuring privacy in virtual sessions, and the digital divide that left some clients without access to counseling services.

CONCLUSIONS:

The online session provided an essential platform for MSW students to understand the shifting dynamics of counseling practices during the COVID-19 lockdown. The session emphasized the need for flexibility, adaptability, and the importance of technological proficiency in maintaining effective counseling services during crises. It also prepared the students to consider these challenges in their future practices, especially in terms of addressing ethical concerns and accessibility issues in a digital counseling environment.

The training emphasized not only the technical aspects of PowerPoint but also the importance of visual storytelling and effective communication. Participants left with improved design and presentation skills, which will be beneficial for future projects and presentations.

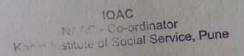

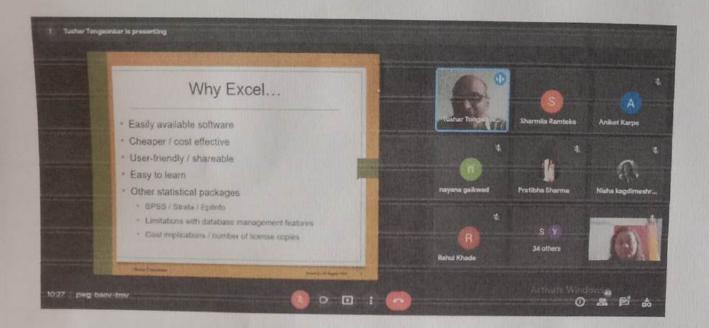
OBJECTIVES:

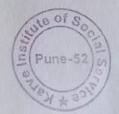

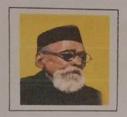

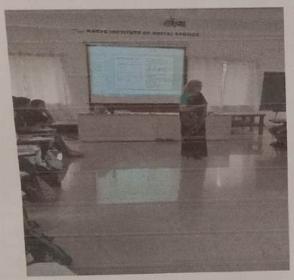
4. Execution:

Report on "Women's Safety"

Objective of the Campaign

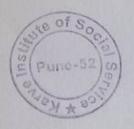
