Introduction:

The "Fire and Safety" workshop was organized on January 19, 2019, at Patel Hall by Karve Institute of Social Service, Pune. With an increasing emphasis on workplace safety and preparedness, the workshop aimed at educating participants on the critical aspects of fire safety and emergency response measures. The session was facilitated by two expert trainers, Mr. M.N. Sanyal and Mr. Vivek Naidu, both of whom are recognized professionals in fire and safety training.

Moreover, the session highlighted the importance of fire drills and emergency evacuation plans, which the participants realized were often neglected.

Learning:

Key learnings from the workshop included:

- Understanding the different classes of fire (A, B, C, D, and K) and the specific extinguishing agents required for each.
- Practical training on the correct usage of fire extinguishers.
- Procedures for evacuation during a fire emergency, including assembly point management and first-aid for burn injuries.
- The importance of regular fire safety inspections in workplaces and homes.
- Legal obligations and safety regulations related to fire prevention in institutions and industries.

The "Fire and Safety" workshop was an informative and practical session that equipped participants with essential knowledge about fire hazards and the necessary preventive and reactive measures. The hands-on training provided by Mr. Sanyal and Mr. Naidu left a lasting impression on all participants, ensuring that they are better prepared to handle fire-related emergencies. Moving forward, it is crucial that the knowledge gained during this workshop be applied not only in professional settings but also in personal life to create safer environments for all.














how self-awareness can positively influence both personal and professional aspects of their lives. The exercises on self-reflection encouraged participants to be more mindful of their actions and responses to various situations.















Learning:

INTRODUCTION:




IMPACT:

- Students through their field work engagement has increased awareness and understanding of water scarcity issues within participating communities.



IMPACT:




IMPACT:





Report on "Self Awareness Workshop"

1. Introduction:



3. Participation:



5. Impact:





Report on Dealing with Issues of Water & Sanitation


